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## A tree-mendous effort

There were doubts about whether we could run our usual Christmas tree collection service in January but with the support of our volunteers and staff we were able to go ahead with the collections all managed safely within the Covid guidelines.

This year was our most successful year, collecting 1,600 trees over five days and raising £21,000 for patient care.

The trees were taken to Woolley Edge Christmas Tree Farm where they were chipped and will be used on the farm as mulch to help grow new trees this year.

We would like to say a huge thank you to all the volunteers who helped. Arrow Self Drive and SB Wakefield for the loan of the collection vans, DHL who planned the collection routes and Woolley Edge Christmas Tree Farm for their support.

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Wakefield 10K goes virtual

In February we made the difficult decision not to hold the Wakefield 10K road race that was due to take place on Sunday 21 March.

The event had already been postponed twice due to the pandemic and with the safety of our runners, volunteers and staff our priority we felt this was the most sensible decision.

Over 1,100 runners had already paid to enter the race so we asked them to donate their entry fee to the hospice and run their own 10K. We have been overwhelmed by the generosity and support we have received with so many of the runners donating and running their own 10K or 1K mini-run for children.

Many thanks to Card Factory Foundation for sponsoring the Wakefield 10K, we are very grateful for their continued support and partnership.

We would like to express our thanks to all the runners who supported the Wakefield 10K and generously donated their entry fee and raised sponsorship helping to raise £25,000 for patient care. We are so grateful and all being well we look forward to running together on Sunday 20 March 2022 when we hope to host a live 10K.



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## We continue to care 24/7

Wow – what a year it has been for everyone! The pandemic came at us like a roller coaster and just like all other health care services the hospice had to adapt very quickly to new ways of caring for our patients. Care and compassion has never been so important and I

would like to say how proud I am of the staff at the hospice who have kept the person at the centre of all that we do even if we have to do it in masks and visors!

In March 2020
we made the
decision to close
the day therapy unit
for face to face
support – for what we
thought would be a few

weeks! Since this time we have provided telephone calls to patients, carers and bereaved families to ensure they were not left feeling isolated. Especially as so many of our patient groups are highly vulnerable and were required to shield. We provided Christmas activities and contact and since November our music therapist has provided virtual music therapy to patients and carers. This is proving very effective especially for those people living with a diagnosis of dementia.

Our bereavement counsellor has provided virtual support for bereaved families and we are now at the stage of being able to offer socially distanced face to face support where needed. We have also been a key member of the Yorkshire and Harrogate

Grief and Loss Helpline service supporting people across the region experiencing a bereavement.

In August we wished our long serving medical director, Dr Anne-Marie Seymour, a fond farewell.

Anne-Marie retired after working at the hospice

for 24 years; in recognition of her service the Day Therapy Unit has been

> renamed 'The Seymour Suite' as a tribute to the dedication and commitment Anne-Marie gave to the hospice movement and end of life

The hospice has always been a key partner in educating and upskilling other health and social care providers. This has continued during the last 12 months through virtual platforms. We

care planning –
allowing people to

with another hospice to upskill care staff to talk to people with life limiting illnesses and their families in a more caring and

We have continued to support patients all through the pandemic both to improve symptoms, quality of life and to meet the end of life needs of those who spend their last days and hours in Wakefield Hospice. To do this we have found inventive ways of keeping families connected. including talking books and cards, facetime, email and the dreaded Zoom! It has also been incredibly important for us to support compassionate visiting for patients approaching end of life - including pets where


online gallery as a permanent tribute to all those special people we're celebrating with our beautiful display.


## **Butterfly Appeal**

## Our work funded by grants

Grant funding has been instrumental in meeting unforeseen and unbudgeted costs, supported new ways of working and launched new projects as the hospice adapted to working in the pandemic.

Funders themselves have been put under incredible pressure and the hospice remains forever grateful for every single penny received, helping us through these turbulent times and working towards a brighter future.

#### Some key highlights include:

- **£41,900** emergency 'coronavirus' grants
- Winning £10,000 worth of Visualite technology (sensory and wellbeing lighting) at the European Healthcare Design Congress
