Usual role hours/shift:

Typically open Monday - Friday 9.00am - 4.00pm

Reporting absences:

If you are unwell, going on holiday or are otherwise unable to undertake your shift, please contact the E-commerce Manager or the Volunteer Services department as soon as possible.

Volunteers may be asked to help with:

- Writing informative and accurate descriptions of the items we are selling including details about condition, measurements and any defects or flaws.
- Making sure the item is placed in the correct selling category to make it easy for customers to find just what they are looking for
- Helping to upload photos to really showcase the items.
- Desire to learn and research items we list
- Willingness to work in the team
- Accuracy and eye for the details
